



# Certified Phlebotomy Technician



## Curriculum

Phlebotomists are Allied Health professionals who draw blood from patients for diagnostic, therapeutic, or donation purposes. Phlebotomists are responsible for preparing patients and obtaining high quality specimens for transport to the lab. In addition, they must have good manual dexterity, excellent communication skills, great organizational skills, and a good knowledge of lab specimen requirements and departmental policies.

This program consists of classes 2 days per week for a total of 190 classroom/lab hours. The clinical component will consist of obtaining a minimum of 100 documented venipunctures and 10 dermal punctures in a clinical setting. After successful completion of the course, students will then be eligible to sit for the NHA CPT National Certification Exam.
